

School Supplies:

Please send the following supplies to school. *Items needing to be labeled with your child's name are all clothing, (we do wear uniforms and we all look the same!), backpack, blanket, supply box, and folders.* Check with your child during the year to make sure they still have the supplies they need. We will put their extra supplies in their cubby so that they may be use as needed.

1. Crayons (8 basic to start with)
2. 2 Pencils (sharpened)
3. 8 Glue sticks
4. 1 small white glue (NO gel please)
5. 2 pocket folders (label with name)
6. 2 large boxes of tissue
7. 2 Baby wipes (container or refill)
8. 1 Small bottle of hand sanitizer
9. 1 pair of scissors (Fiskar brand or steel blade preferred)
10. 1 Pencil box
11. 1 paint shirt (old shirt from home)
12. 1 rest mat (cost \$12.00) see teacher
13. 1 crib size blanket (with name)
14. \$40.00 activity fee

Also, I recommend a backpack or tote bag. Children often have much to carry, and this helps keep them organized.

Behavior Expectations:

Take Home Folders:

The homework folder listed on the supply list will be used as a take home folder. **Please check these folders nightly and return them each day.** All important papers and finished work will be sent home in this folder each day. The other folder will be kept in the classroom for class use.

Homework:

Your child will have homework each Friday for the week. It will reflect the skills that we are covering. Homework is due the following Monday. If the homework appears to be too difficult or too easy for your child, feel free to contact me. We reward students who bring in their homework, weekly. It begins a great habit for a successful school career.

Newsletter:

We want to make sure you are informed of upcoming events and what your child is learning in school. A newsletter will come home weekly, but your child's work will come home daily. Newsletters will contain upcoming events and information pertinent to the coming week.

About Us:

I am an experienced teacher who has been blessed to be teaching here at SCA. This year will begin my 27th year. I am a mother of two sons who both attended SCA. My sons, 31yrs & 27yrs., both have wonderful memories of their experience at SCA. I have a granddaughter who graduated from SCA and a grandson who we look forward to coming to SCA when he is of age.
