Science	All science this week will be through the study of Greece and will be completed at school. Greeks developed ideas we use today in medicine, physics, biology and math. Euclid and Pythagoras formed geometry theories, and Democritus believed all things were made up of atoms.	

History **Mon.** Be prepared to take notes from a Greek presentation by Mrs. Bezzerides. She will discuss things like our laws being based on those of the Greeks. The first part of your study will be a map of Greece showing the Red Sea, the Mediterranean Sea, the Black Sea, the Caspian Sea, Athens, and Turkey. She will discuss some of the temples, theaters, Ionic columns, Doric column, and the Corinthian column.
Students will select from a number of projects to complete at home for extra credit. Students have the option of bringing the food items (sesame bread, Greek Salad, Barley Stew, or other Greek dish that you made) on Monday rather than Friday of this week.
