

School Supplies:

Please send the following supplies to school. *The items needing to be labeled with your child's name on all clothing, back pack or tote bag, blanket/bedding, scissors, and pencil box.* Check with your child during the year to make sure they still have the supplies they need. We will put their extra supplies in a file marked with their name so that they may stock up as needed.

1. 8 Crayons (No jumbo) 2 pencils, sharpened
2. 8 Crayons Jumbo size (Pre Sch)
3. 8 glue sticks
4. Scissors (*labeled with name*)
5. 1 eraser
6. 1 box of markers
7. 1 large boxes of tissue
8. 1 bottle of white glue
9. 2 disposable cameras
10. Twin size blanket & sheet (with name E K only)
11. Crib size sheet (Pre Sch. only)
12. \$30.00 activity fee (EK only)
13. \$25.00 activity fee (Pre. Sch. only)
14. Watercolors
15. 2 Baby wipes

Also, we recommend but not require a backpack or tote bag. Children often have much to carry, and this helps keep them organized.

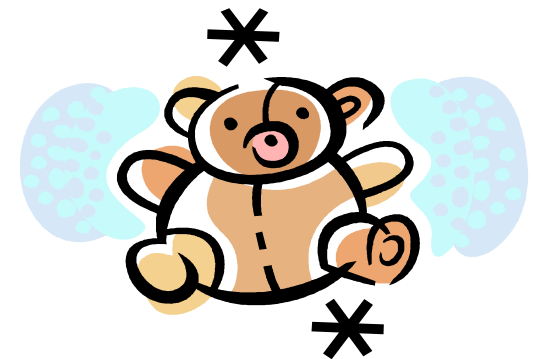

Behavior Expectations:

We will be using the "crayon chart" system to help monitor these behaviors. You will receive information about your child's behavior daily.

Homework:

Your child will be given homework each Monday for the week. This completed homework packet is due back to school on Friday. It will reflect the skills that we are covering. If the homework appears to be too difficult or too easy for your child, feel free to modify it. We do not punish children who don't return their homework, but we often reward those who do.

Newsletter:

We want to make sure you are informed of upcoming events and what your child is learning in school. A weekly newsletter will come home, but your child's work will come home daily. It will contain schedules and information pertinent to the coming week.
