You have a choice of six different subjects from which you may choose to research about Greece. **ALL information must be in your own words.** Copying from a book or internet is plagiarism and is not acceptable. You may choose to **include** (pictures cannot be your entire report) pictures particularly if you are writing about art. Take notes. **In order to get the full number of points available, the work must be high quality. Be sure your research paper has a title page and a bibliography (You are allowed to use your notes from Mrs. B. but must include her in the bibliography).**

There are some books available in the classroom. These books must stay in the classroom since they are on loan. Please feel free to use the computer and internet for research too. Please make arrangements with the computer teacher to obtain the usage of a computer if you do not have a computer at home.

4. **Greek Philosophy (choose one of the Greek philosophers from the back page**
5. **Ancient Greek Gods** (Please limit your research to the main **twelve** over which **Zeus** was the chief.)

### 6. **Greek Literature**

If you choose to research Greek literature, it is necessary to read some of the literature. Youth versions of the *Iliad* and *Odyssey* are available in the library. It is helpful to have knowledge of the ancient Greek gods to enjoy these. Mrs. Leslie has Core Knowledge Greek literature pertaining to *Daphne*, *Iliad*, *Odyssey*, etc. Please see her for copies. You must site Core Knowledge as a source.
